About the two-day Workshop:

Dynamic teaching strategies will show:

- How to activate healing and self-righting tendencies from the initial moments of the first session and thereafter throughout therapy
- How to work with the experience of attachment within the therapeutic relationship
- How to process core affect until adaptive healing resources are released and harnessed in the service of transforming trauma and actualizing transformational potentials

Extensive videotaped case examples of both teachers' work will show a range of interventions such as:

- Actively and explicitly working with the experience of the attachment relationship between patient and therapist
- Using that relationship to regulate, deepen and work through intense affective experience
- Becoming a “transformation detective” in order to catalyze and make active use of transformational processes
